CATHOLIC CHARITIES CELEBRATES 20 YEARS PROVIDING FIRST STEP PROGRAM SERVICES



Twenty years ago, Catholic Charities' leadership in the Diocese of Youngstown came together to talk about services for women and children. Our adoption program was experiencing very little activity, and we were seeing more women making the decision to parent their children—even if that meant facing significant financial and emotional challenges. We realized that we needed to do more to support these women who were choosing life despite their circumstances, as well as those families who needed our help to give their babies and toddlers the best possible start in life. Thus, the **First Step Pregnancy and Family Support Program** was born (pun intended)!

First Step Programs are offered at each of the three Catholic Charities agencies serving our six-county diocese, providing material assistance (food, formula, diapers and other baby essentials) and case management (support and assistance accessing information and resources).

From the beginning, demand for the First Step program has been great. First Step for Change was developed to help raise funds to maintain a robust supply of material goods for First Step clients and families. An annual campaign since 2004, First Step for Change engages our Catholic parishes in the pro-life mission of Catholic Charities to assist pregnant women and families who look to us for help and hope.

A WELCOME SURPRISE!

"Kimberly" came to Catholic Charities to inquire about our First Step program. She had only recently learned that she was seven months pregnant! She had been told by medical professionals that she would never be able to have children, so you can imagine how shocked and overwhelmed she felt when she came to us for help. Our First Step case worker assisted Kimberly with finding prenatal care and provided tangible resources, such as a "newborn kit" (diapers, wipes, clothing, bath supplies, etc.), a bassinet, and a baby rocker. The case worker also connected Kimberly with the local health department for a car seat and helped her sign up for the WIC program. Kimberly was exceedingly grateful to Catholic Charities for providing baby items, resources, and moral support during a new and unexpected phase of her life.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES REGIONAL AGENCY OPENS 2ND LOCATION, VOICE OF HOPE SHELTER II

In January 2021, Catholic Charities Regional Agency opened an emergency shelter for homeless women and children called the Voice of Hope Shelter. This was in response to the shortage of family beds for emergency shelter in the community and made possible by CARES Act funds. Within days the shelter was full and developed a waiting list. Over the last 2 years a waiting list has been maintained and the need for a second shelter was identified and made possible by continued CARES Act funds. In the past 2 years there have been 99 individuals, or 65 families sheltered, with 45 families transitioned into some form of permanent housing or program. The shortage of adequate housing is a wideranging issue that many communities are facing. The shelter is intended to be a 30-day shelter with discharge planning that starts upon admission. The average length of stay has run closer to 60 days due to difficulty with finding housing.


